KIA ORA E TE WHĀNAU,

It has been a very quiet kura this week, with 53 children off at Lonsdale for camp. Kōrora and Kōtare have had a combined 3 day camp as part of our Education Outside the Classroom programme. This included activites such as a Commando Course, Confidence Course, Nature Trail. Team Building activities and tabloid sports as well as a trip to Te Ngaere Bay for a swim. Thanks to the teachers and all the parent volunteers who have worked hard to ensure a safe camp experience for all.

On Thursday morning the Teina (Junior) team had their own EOTC experience with a walk to Mt Manaia as part of our Inquiry into "Our Stories". Matua Reuben shared 2 versions of the legend of Manaia. The children then enjoyed 4 different learning activities;

- using their senses in the bush; this will then be used for a poem
- drawing Mt Manaia (observational sketching)
- listening to the History of our area and comparing the life of Early Settlers and that of traditional Māori society
- scavenger hunt; finding natural objects

It was another well run event; it we are so blessed to have such an important landmark in our very own "backyard".

Karearea are finalising the arrangements for their upcoming camp to Bay of Islands in early Term 2. To help reduce costs they are hosting fundraising events like this weeks sausage sizzle. Please support them as the trip will be an amazing way for our children to learn all about early life in NZ by visiting our first capital city - Kororāreka.

Ruru have 2 fun filled days planned for the end of term; with a sleepover at school. They will visit Proctor's as well as Smugglers; as well as a visit to the Bream Head Trust Nursery.

Using our local environment to engage our learners is a core part of how we Grow and Learn Together here at Whangārei Heads School.

The following is a statement that outlines how Health Education is delivered at Whangarei Heads School


Please complete the form below by Friday 14th March.

We can see from your input where most people would prefer we invest our focus across the 7 Learning Areas: See bar graph at the base of the page.



Fishing Comp Rules for 2025

This year new rules have been introduced as we move towards making the event more sustainable, such as a limit to the number of fish you can enter, and a limit to the length of Snapper - anything over 55cm can only be entered into Catch-and-release. Head to the Funky Fish website - funkyfishing.co.nz/rules/ - for the full list of competition rules.

Take note of the 2-digit Competition Code release information for the Catchand-Release categories. These fish must be photographed with your entry ticket, and the Competition Code must be written on the ticket and visible in the photo.

The "Funkiest Fish" is back with two categories:

1. The most interesting catch-and-release fish caught

2. Design your own "funkiest fish" – not a live animal but rather something you can create. Ideas might include using; a rock, a piece of bark, items from the beach or even get really artistic with mosaic, or paper mache or any art materials from home.

OUR EXPECTATIONS FOR STUDENT ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance at school is important to your child's success and there is a clear connection between going to school regularly and doing well in the classroom. Making sure students attend and engage in learning is a shared responsibility.

As a parent, you are responsible for making sure your child attends school every day. If your child is going to be absent for any reason it is essential that you let us know as soon as possible.

It is important that you phone us/send us an email/message us on ClassDojo to confirm your child's absence and provide us with the reason.

We acknowledge that there are genuine reasons students may occasionally be absent. However, without regular attendance your child will struggle to make progress. If your child is absent regularly, or for extended periods, we will reach out to you to discuss the situation.

We are committed to supporting your child to attend school.

If you're having difficulty getting your child to school, you can ask for support by:

- speaking with your child's teacher
- sending us a message on ClassDojo
- calling or emailing the office

We can work with you to develop a support plan that addresses any barriers to regular attendance.

Drop off and pick up times

As a way to acknowledge the challenges on whanau to get to town in the morning, we allow drop offs from 8.15 am, rather than the usual 8.30am.

However; some whanau are dropping their children as early as 8.05am. This is our preparation time; where teachers are setting up for the day, gathering resources, and possibly having a quick meeting with our SENCO or Senior Leadership team.

Can you please ensure you are dropping your child off no earlier than 8.15am. Thanks.

End of day seems to be working well, and thank you to the whanau who now join us for the end of day Karakia, it is lovely to have you with us. Most children are collected by 3.05pm which is wonderful as that allows the teachers to get sorted for the next days learning, or head to our meetings.
