Thank you all for coming along to our "Meet the Teacher" evening last week. It was wonderful to see so many of you here, enjoying a lovely evening in our school grounds, connecting with one another, and finding our more about how each learning environment makes our vision come alive. "Our Place to Grow and Learn Together", Ko tātou kura, kia tipu, kia ako ngātahi. It was an authentic example of whanaungatanga.

We have updated our Strategic Plan for the final year of its three phases. Our focus this year is on;

- enhancing learner agency
- assessment for learning
- curriculum design in Mathematics to include Structured Maths
- Structured literacy changing the way we teach and learn in reading and spelling
- Inquiry learning

I have included the Strategic Plan Road Map on the next page for you. We will begin to consult on the next 3 years plan for the direction of the school mid year. We will be asking for your input so we can continue to grow our Kura.

Watch out for the Health Curriculum Community Consultation survey that will come out Monday, in your emails. This feedback will help us to plan for how we teach Health and Physical Education for the next 2 years.

I have already received a few requests for children to be absent from school for extended periods of time for holidays and whanau time again this year. I really need to urge you to reconsider. I know that it is often cheaper to travel in term time, but there is a cost to your child's learning. We are finding that when children are away they lose the connection to what the class is learning, as well as for some, friendships change. We had to put some children, who had significant lengths of time away overseas, into our intervention programmes to "catch up" the learning missed, or the teachers had to take this extra mahi on. All hubs are open from 9:00am until 12:00pm unless otherwise stated.


